

 Awareness of Community Paramedic has doubled since 2012 from 4% to 8%







Historical perspective


- 1997: Development of the National Occupational Competency Profile (NOCP) – Federal Government funded
- 2001: Approval by the Board of the Paramedic Association of Canada, acceptance by the Canadian Medical Association for the purpose of accreditation of educational programs
- 2011: Revised NOCP, inclusion of Health Promotion and Public Safety (recognition of non-urgent care and contribution)
- 2015: New Canadian Paramedic Profile




- The NOCP was the reference document for curriculum development.

 - Weaknesses: Ineffective for regulation, standards of practice, code of ethics; essentially a skills document

















