






Introduction to Nunavut – Health Challenges


- Prevalence of Chronic Diseases: Higher prevalence of certain chronic conditions like respiratory diseases and diabetes.
- Mental Health and Substance Use: Challenges related to mental health and substance abuse within the community.
- Access to Medical Services: Limited access to healthcare facilities, specialized care, and the reliance on medical travel.
- Environmental Impact: Extreme weather conditions and geographical isolation complicate emergency medical responses and regular healthcare delivery.



• Combination of self-study, in-class sessions, telehealth presentations, and hands-on practice


Evaluation:




