The Gift of Time: Management of Duchenne's Muscular Dystrophy in the MIH Environment



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Epidemiology

- 1:3500 1:5000 incidence per male births
- X- linked recessive condition
- Maternal transmission in roughly 2/3 of cases
- Presentation usually occurs by 5 y/o with motor delays
- Wheelchair bound on average by 13 y/o
- Mean life expectancy is 29 y/o
- 80% of cases result from exonic deletion affecting the dystrophin gene

The Case:

- 11 y/o male
- Had been enrolled in an experimental drug trial requiring weekly travel to Portland, OR and Salt Lake City, UT
- Family was separated during these treatments.
- The patient lives in a remote region of Colorado
- Contacted by the specialty pharmacy, looking for someone to provide in-home infusions.

The Team

Children's Hospital Orsini Pharmacy Sarepta Pharmaceuticals Delta County Ambulance District MIH Team

Treatment

- Port Access
- Infusions
- \$20k per infusion
- Exon skipping medication, allowed for the genetic coding of a shortened version of dystrophin.
